
### Masquerace Jewelly Sale



#### Feeling Lucky? Run for Special Olympics!

#### 7 Mile Run

In the Lucky 7 run, you can sign up as an individual and run the entire seven-mile course yourself, you can sign up as part of a relay team, or you can participate in our one-mile fun run. A relay team can be made up of 3-7 participants who will decide which leg of the course they will run.

#### 7 Mile Poker Run

Participants who are participating as individuals will have the opportunity to up their ante to the Poker Run edition, a high-stakes version of the Lucky 7, for an extra \$10.



The paved course will follow a seven-mile track. Shuttles will be available to transport runners, volunteers and spectators from both restaurants.
